

Fact Sheet: HKU Cyberport Campus (Cyberport 4)

Hong Kong's Cyberport is a flagship, US\$2 billion (HK\$15.8 billion), 24-hectare landmark IT project wholly owned by the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR).

The campus is in a unique location that benefits from convenient access to the rest of the city and enjoys a magnificent sea view. Featuring first-class office space, a retail and entertainment complex, a five-star hotel and deluxe residential complex, the campus is world-class academic centre for interactive learning and networking.

Accommodation

Overseas students can stay in the five-star hotel Le Méridien Cyberport. All rooms are comfortably furnished and equipped with advanced facilities.

HKU Business School campus layout

HKU Business School occupies approximately 40,000 sq feet of space comprising:

- two tiered classrooms
- four flat classrooms
- 16 breakout rooms
- two executive lounges for study and dining.

IT facilities

- Free Wi-Fi access for all staff and students of the University
- Connected to the Cyberport core network, internet speed is amongst the fastest in Hong Kong with data throughput speeds up to 12GBps locally and 2.3GBps internationally
- Multiple tiered and flat classrooms with full audio/video and videoconference facilities
- Classrooms and meeting rooms with:
 - high quality acoustics
 - ergonomic and IT friendly furniture with retractable power connections on tabletops
 - latest audio and video equipment with large plasma TV screens supporting high-definition broadcasts
 - four-way simultaneous video conference support over ISDN and/or H.323 with T1 connection
 - wireless-enabled projectors and screens
 - state-of-the-art touch panel control over lighting, curtains, audio/video and video conference equipment
 - lightweight portable computers and lecterns
 - wireless microphone and speaker system
- Smartcard readers for security control
- Closed-circuit security control all over the campus
- University, faculty and international news broadcasts on plasma TV screens in public areas.
