### **Former Dean, now President, Robin Buchanan, London Business School**

Robin Buchanan joined London Business School in September 2007. He was formerly the Senior Partner in the UK of Bain & Company Inc., the global business consultancy, and brings more than 35 years of experience to the School. President Buchanan was awarded an MBA with High Distinction (Baker Scholar) from Harvard Business School. He is a Fellow of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of England & Wales.

Professor Sir Andrew Likierman is London Business School's new Dean. Andrew was educated at the University of Vienna and Balliol College Oxford. He was the founder Director of the Executive MBA programme and has lectured on all the School's major degree and executive programmes. Andrew is also Chairman of the National Audit Office, Director of Barclays Bank plc, and a Trustee of the Institute for Government.

### **Dean Gary Biddle, Faculty of Business and Economics, The University of Hong Kong**

Professor Biddle is Dean and PCCW Chair Professor at the Faculty of Business and Economics. He is a prominent scholar in the field of accounting and finance with publications in top academic journals and the financial press, including the *Wall Street Journal*.

Professor Biddle earned his MBA and PhD degrees at the University of Chicago and served as professor at the University of Washington and the University of Chicago before coming to Hong Kong in 1996. He has received numerous awards for teaching excellence in both the US and Asia, including the world's top-ranked programmes.

### **Dean Glenn Hubbard, Columbia Business School**

Internationally renowned economist Glenn Hubbard was named Dean of Columbia Business School in 2004. A Columbia faculty member since 1988, he is also the Russell L. Carson Professor of Finance and Economics and holds a joint appointment with Columbia University's economics department. His research spans tax policy, monetary economics, corporate finance, and international finance.

Professor Hubbard received his PhD in economics from Harvard University in 1983 and began his teaching career at Northwestern University. From February 2001 until March 2003, he was Chairman of the U.S. Council of Economic Advisers under President George W. Bush.
